# Bangabandhu Sheikh Mujibur Rahman Father of Maritime Bangladesh

After liberation during 1972-75, Bangabandhu's role in the rehabilitation, reformation & development of shipping & marine sector of Bangladesh was outstanding.

### **Maritime Scenario after Liberation**

After liberation in 1971, the shipping sector's scenario was miserable. The occupation Pakistani Army took away all the merchant ships and left Chittagong Port with hidden mines all around under the water. Destroyed naval/merchant ships were submerged in the Karnaphuly channel; as a result, the foreign ships were not willing to call here and insurance companies imposed increased premium on ships calling Chittagong Port. Upon return to new country Bangladesh on 10th January 1972 (from the imprisonment in Pakistan), the father of the nation Bangabandhu Sheikh Mujibur Rahman took all possible efforts to build and organize the country in all sectors including shipping; despite all out national & international resistances against the war-bashed just-born Bangladesh, successes were tremendous during his very short period of 1972-75 (before been assassinated in 1975).

### March of Maritime Bangladesh

Bangabandhu managed to resume functioning of Marine Academy and Seamen's Training Centre immediately. He established the 'Bangladesh shipping Corporation' on 5th February 1972. He also managed to procure 19 ocean-going ships at almost free of cost from various friendly countries by 1975; later, by 1983, more 13 ships including 4 brand new ships from Japan (ref: his renowned Japan trip in 1974) were added to the BSC fleet out of his initiatives. Despite hard competition in the then shipping world, the new-born BSC made distinct profit throughout 70's. Upon his request, a group of Russian maritime experts came to Bangladesh and cleared off the hidden/floating mines and submerged hazards from the Karnaphuly channel in 1972. Before return, at Bangabandhu's initiative and request, they established Marine Fisheries Academy in 1973 in Chittagong. Bangabandhu commenced the long pending work of the construction of the Chittagong Dry Dock & Heavy Industries (commissioned in 1983). Smaller ship-construction (upto 1,000 DWT) commenced in Khulna Shipyard in 1972. Oil and gas exploration in the Bay of Bengal was commenced in 1973 with promulgating Petroleum Act 1974. Informatively, besides being the Prime Minister, additionally he was also the Shipping Minister for a period of 8 July 1974 – 26 Jan 1975.

#### Back the Sailors, Build the Nation!

However due to obvious shortage of seafaring personnel, all the BSC ships used to be mainly manned by foreigners. Shortage of shore-experts in maritime administration, shipping companies, ports and in training centres was more than that at sea. Right after liberation, different foreign countries specially UK (British Technical Aid) and UNDP Funding came forward to train our seafarers. At this stage the newly formed 'Bangladesh Merchant Marine Officers' Association' raised a slogan – Back the Sailors, Build the Nation!

### **Development of Marine Academy**

Bangabandhu took a project titled 'Development of Marine Academy' in 1973; the various newer infrastructures we see today were the direct output of that visionary initiative. Such development raised the Academy for being selected as one of the 14 branches of the IMO's World Maritime University (Sweden) in 1990 and Bangladesh could earn the coveted position in the IMO White List in 2000. Thus Bangladesh has become blessed with a number of seafarers and maritime experts.

Therefore, the Father of the Nation was Father of Maritime Bangladesh indeed!

### Bangabandhu's contribution - At a Glance

- 7. Establishment of Marine Fisheries Academy in 1973.
- 8. Commencement of construction oft Chittagong Dry Dock & Heavy Industries (commissioned in 1983).
- 9. Commencement of Oil & Gas exploration in Bay of Bengal in 1973; Promulgated Petroleum Act 1974.
- 10. Besides being the Prime Minister, he also performed as Shipping Minister (8 July 1974 26 Jan 1975).

### **Bangladesh Marine Academy (BMA)**

### **Development scenario during 2009 – 2015**

Bangladesh Marine Academy, an organ of Ministry of Shipping, is producing professionally sound, environmentally aware, intelligent and smart Marine Cadets for over five decades. Selected HSC (A-Levels) students are being trained to be Marine Cadets as per IMO – UN (International Maritime Organisation – United Nations) standard (STCW – Standard of Training, Certification and Watchkeeping for Seafarers Convention).

BMA has produced around 4,000 Nautical & Marine Engineering Cadets since its inception in 1962 till 2015 for world shipping industry. Besides, over 30,000 Marine Officer & Marine Engineers have been trained with preparatory & ancillary courses since 1980 till 2015. The Academy was established in 1962 as 'Mercantile Marine Academy'. During our liberation war the Pakistan Government shifted the function of the Academy to Karachi keeping this Academy as abandoned.

After our liberation, right after returning from confinement in Pakistan, Father of the Nation Bangabandhu Sheikh Mujibur Rahman resumed this Academy as 'Bangladesh Marine Academy'. Capt (Merchant Marine) M L Rahman was appointed as the 1st Bengalee Commandant. Remarkable development could be ensured through his initiated project titled 'Development of Marine Academy 1973'. At the same time, with British Technical Assistance, the Academy could be elevated to a distinct international position by 70's. As a result, this Academy was awarded a Branch status in 1990 as 1 of the 14 branches of World Maritime University, Sweden (established in 1983 & managed by IMO).

Upon assuming the responsibility of the country by the current Government under the able leadership of **Hon'ble Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina** in 2009, due to over-all success and development during last 7 years, the international standing of the Academy has been strengthened remarkably. The development scenario has been attached overleaf.

## **About Academy**

Bangladesh Marine Academy is a full-governmental maritime educational institution managed by the Ministry of Shipping. It offers courses of all levels of sea-services from Pre-Sea Cadet Training upto Master Mariner/Chief Engineer.

The Academy was founded as Mercantile Marine Academy in 1962 by the then Government of Pakistan over 40 acres land over the valleys of Juldia Point at the south bank of river Karnafuly where it meets the Bay of Bengal. During liberation war in 1971, the Pakistan Government shifted the Academy at Karachi abandoning this establishment. After liberation, Bangabandhu Sheikh Mujibur Rahman, the Father of Maritime Bangladesh, commenced the Academy with a new name 'Bangladesh Marine Academy' and appointing first Bengalee Commandant Capt. M L Rahman MM (Merchant Marine) in January 1971. Under a project named 'Development of Bangladesh Marine Academy – 1973', the Academy had been developed to a remarkable extent with various new physical & academic infrastructure with addition of 60 acres of land resulting total area to 100 acres.

Untill 2009, it provided Pre-Sea Cadet Training courses in Nautical Science & Marine Engineering disciplines. However since 2010, the Academy expanded its course areas for all higher levels of Maritime Education. Today it offers all the preparatory & ancillary courses upto Class I (Master Mariner & Chief Engineer) level. Cadets intake per year per batch has been increased to 275 from average 50 (1962-2008). Door has been opened for Female Cadets in 2012.

It also commenced research & maritime consultancy for national & international organizations like ILO, IMO-NORAD & WMU Sweden. Academy is ONE of the FOURTEEN Branches of World Maritime University at Malmö in Sweden that is established and managed by IMO – a specialized agency of UN. The Cadet's Education & Training programme has been duly recognized/accepted by EMSA–EU (European Maritime Safety Authority of European Union), GlobalMET (Global Maritime Education & Training Associatiop – Australia), Intermanager (UK) and MPA (Maritime & Port Authority of Singapore).

The Academy is accountable to the Hon'ble Minister and Secretary of the Ministry of Shipping and is guided by a 10-Member Governing Body headed by the Secretary of the Ministry of Shipping. It strictly meets all the requirements of the IMO's International Convention on the Standards, Training and Certification for Seafarers 1978, as amended. As recognition to this compliance, Bangladesh enjoys a coveted status in the IMO's White List.

With the Mission of 'Developing World Class Maritime Leaders', the Academy has the objectives and goals of offering highest levels of maritime education, leadership and research for young boys and girls to become maritime professionals for national and international shipping fleet and trade. BMA is indeed an institution for the national and international maritime community.

viii) Competencies of Academics: The core competencies are to be expanded through various

professional updating courses particularly in abroad.
